



Columbia County Current Picture: Some numbers*


- •# of farms: 554

- Percent of Children on SNAP (Food Stamps): 11%


























Land Development in Columbia County: Structures Built Along Rt. 9 Corridor




Land Development in Columbia County: Structures Built Along Rt. 9 Corridor


- structures built before 15.3, - between 1948 and 30.



Columbia County relative changes in farm production




Columbia County Change in Farm Size & Number of Farms


