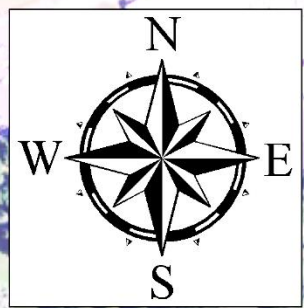
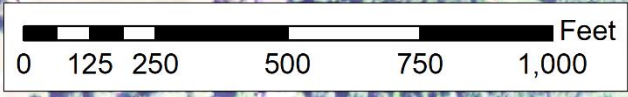

# Winter Botany, Do-It-Yourself Course: Installment 4.

## (ORANGE FLAGGING)

You can park at PS21 and walk down or at Crellin Park and walk up to visit these plants; there are four new flags in Crellin Park and three at PS21

If you're just learning, then use the map to find the plant and consult the table below for ID. If you want to challenge yourself, then don't look at the table below until you have found the flag and made your best guess. TREE #51 = American Basswood (This one is slightly off-trail – from the Crellin parking lot head down towards the creek, go straight when the trail makes a sharp right just before Quiz #15)	TREE #52 = Chestnut Oak
TREE #53 = Bitternut Hickory (I flagged a young one so that you could see the distinctive bud but the medium tree beside this and the larger tree just across the path with the interwoven bark are more mature Bitternuts)	TREE #54 = Actually, a shrub. I flagged a Red Osier Dogwood, but just to the left, and slightly greyer, is a Silky Dogwood.
TREE #55 = Black Locust (the young trees in the PS21 parking lot are thornless Black Locusts)	TREE #56 = Buttonbush (a shrub, again)
TREE #57 = Really, a vine, a grape vine to be precise. Look for it along the tree line below the Buttonbush, it is on the margin of a Red Maple swamp. Watch out for barbed wire!
